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DATE AND PLACE COMPETITION.

The Rowing competition at the XXIII Central American and Caribbean Games Barranquilla 2018 will take place between Friday, July 20 and Monday, July 23, at the Guatapé Reservoir Rowing Course in Antioquia.

THE BOATS

Each NOC must provide its boats in compliance with FISA regulations, as set forth in Chapter 1, Rule 1, paragraphs 1 and 2, Boat Construction; Chapter IV, Rule 33, Free Construction, Chapter VI, Rule 60, Impartiality – Innovations.

The Organizing Committee will facilitate to the NOCs, as required, boats in quotas and leasing conditions that will be set forth in the Leasing Services Guide for NOCs that will be issued by the Organizing Committee.

COMPETITION FORMAT

The Competition Format is based on the World Rowing Federation Rules and will take place as follows:

Qualification series leading to the finals will take place during the first two days of competition, for categories where their entry exceeds the number of six (6); repechâge races will be rowed in the afternoon on the same day of the elimination race, or to assign the lanes to the finals, for categories where entries do not exceed six (6). Program finals will take place during the last TWO days.

GENERAL RULES

The competitions of the XXIII Central American and Caribbean Games Barranquilla 2018 will be held in accordance with CACSO Statutes and the Regulations of the World Rowing Federation, FISA, in force at the time of the Games. Cases not foreseen in the abovementioned regulations will be resolved as follows:

Cases of a general nature will be resolved in accordance to CASCO Statutes and the Regulations of the Central American and Caribbean Games.

Cases of a technical nature will be resolved following the procedures of the World Rowing Federation, FISA.

For the event to be considered official, at least five (5) athletes and/or boats must compete from equal number of National Olympic Committees, as established in CACSO Rules

If after the technical meeting, one or more teams are unable to participate due to force majeure (verified by CACSO), the event will take place with a minimum number of four (4) athletes and/or boats from equal number of National Olympic Committees.

SPECIFIC RULES

As established in the valid rules of the World Rowing Federation, hereinafter FISA, the competition format shall consist of eliminatory regattas, repechâges, semi-finals and finals, based on the number of crews qualified to these Central American and Caribbean Games, in accordance with Chapter VI, Rule 62.

Distribution of competitors in the elimination rounds shall be determined by draw, in accordance with Chapter VI, Rule 63.

Should the number of crews taking part in an event exceed six (6), a progression system shall be used (according to the number of crews entered, in accordance with Chapter VI, Rule 51) established FISA.

Composition of rowers in a crew qualified to the finals may not be changed, neither the order of the crew or to substitute crew members, without prior approval of the Games Committee and other Event Head Officials, as set forth in Chapter VI, Rule 52 and 52 of the FISA Rules of Racing.

To compete in the XXIII Central American and Caribbean Games Barranquilla 2018, athletes are subject to the provisions of the Regulations of the Games, the rules of the World Rowing Federation and must be entered by their NOCs, pursuant to the provisions set forth in Chapter XI of the CACSO Statutes.

ENTRIES

In order to take part in the Rowing Regattas at the XXIII Central American and Caribbean Games Barranquilla 2018, participating countries must be members of the World Rowing Federation, FISA, and the Pan American Rowing Confederation, COPARE, as established in Chapter VI, Rules 45, 46 and 47 of the FISA Rules.

All countries through their respective NOC, must submit their Sports Entry Request using the official form, to the Organizing Committee by 24:00 hours (Colombian time) on **February 20, 2018**. The form must state the sports in which the NOC will participate in the XXIII Central American and Caribbean Games Barranquilla 2018. (The forms that will be published in the official WEB site, "Barranquilla 2018"). Associated Members recognized by the Pan American Confederation of this sport and CACSO may also participate.

ENTRY BY NUMBER

The Entry by Number forms, which state the number of participants in each individual and team event, shall be delivered to the Organizing Committee of the XXIII Central American and Caribbean Games Barranquilla 2018 no later than midnight (Barranquilla, Colombia time) on **April 20, 2018** as established in CACSO Regulations, Chapter VIII.

ENTRY BY NAME

An Entry by Name form is required for each eligible participating athlete in the XXIII Central American and Caribbean Games Barranquilla 2018. Entry by Name forms must be completed by each NOC and received by the Organizing Committee no later than midnight (Barranquilla, Colombia time) on Wednesday, June 20, 2018, as established in CACSO Regulations, Chapter VIII.

Each NOC must submit its Entry by Number and Entry by Name on the official forms provided by the Organizing Committee and which

shall be mailed out 6 months prior to the games.

ENTRIES

Only NOCs recognized by CACSO, which National Rowing Federations are members of the World Rowing Federation, FISA, Fédération Internationale des Sociétés d'Aviron, and COPARE, may enter athletes in the Rowing competitions of the XXIII Central American and Caribbean Games, Barranquilla 2018. Associated members recognized by CACSO also recognized by COPARE may also participate.

MAXIMUM NUMBER OF COMPETITORS

In accordance to the quota established by CACSO, the Rowing competition shall have a maximum of 100 athletes distributed in both modes.

Each NOC may enter a maximum number of twenty (20) athletes, provided they meet the Rowing qualification criteria for the XXIII Central American and Caribbean Games, Barranquilla 2018.

Only one boat may entered per event per NOC.

TECHNICAL MEETING

The Technical Meeting will take place on Thursday, July 19 at 10:00 a.m. at CLUB NAUTICO CALIMA- CALI.

Up to two representatives from each NOC may attend this Technical Meeting.

The invitation for Heads of Teams to attend the Technical Meeting will be available at the Sports Information Center at the Central American and Caribbean Games Villa upon their arrival.

The Technical Delegate, the president of the Jury and the Organizing Committee Competition Manager will preside the meeting, which will take place in Spanish with translation into English.

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Each participating NOC may accredit a maximum of two (2) international umpires, pursuant to FISA Rule 81. The number of umpires can be completed by the host country with national umpires licensed by the Colombian Canoeing and Rowing Federation; should the Federation not have a sufficient number of officials, COPARE shall be responsible for their appointment.

The Technical Delegate will determine who will be the General Director of the Regatta and the President of the Jury (preferably FISA umpires) and, jointly based on the nominations received from participating countries, will appoint the remaining jury. The different positions to be held during the days of the Regatta will be designated by the President of the Jury.

Twenty (20) international umpires must be appointed. Should the necessary number not be met, the umpire pool may be expanded to COPARE member countries.

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PROTESTS AND APPEALS

Protests shall be resolved pursuant to FISA Rules, Chapter VI, rules 78 and 79.

DRAW

The draw for lane assignment will take place during the Technical Meeting to be held 24 hours prior to the start of the heats, in a facility close to the Regatta Course. The Technical Meeting will be presided by the Technical Delegate, the General Director of the Regatta and the President of the Jury. Team Directors must attend, as can attend umpires and coaches as established in FISA Rules, Chapter VI, Rule 63.

WEIGHING

Rowers weighing will take place two hours before the start of the Regatta. Weighing will be supervised by the designated umpires, in accordance with FISA Rules, Chapter II, Rule 26.

Boat weighing will be supervised by assigned umpires in accordance with FISA Rules, Chapter IV, Rule 34.

EQUIPAMIENTO DEPORTIVO

Double Sculls: 2X

Pair: 2-

Technical specifications for these are standardized by the manufacturers in accordance with Chapter III, Classes of Boats, Rule 30.

Men: 1X, 2X, 2-

Women: 1X, 2X, 2-

Men Lightweight: 1X, 2X, 2-

Women Lightweight: 1X, 2X

The Organizing Committee and the Pan American Rowing Confederation, COPARE, guarantee and will make available to those NOCs that request it, lease of the boats necessary for prior training and for the compe

MEDAL CEREMONY.

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Medal ceremonies will be held pursuant to CACSO Regulations, Chapter XIII.

INDIVIDUAL COMPETITION

First Place: Gold medal and diploma

Second Place: Silver medal and diploma

Third place: Bronze medal and diploma

TEAM EVENTS

First place: A diploma for the team and one gold medal and a diploma for each of its athletes.

Second place: A diploma for the team and one silver medal and a diploma for each of its athletes.

Third place: A diploma for the team and one bronze medal and a diploma for each of its athletes.

DOPING CONTROL

The Medical Committee of the XXIII Central American and Caribbean Games Barranquilla 2018 Organizing Committee will perform the doping control, following the provisions of CACSO Medical Commission and Anti-Doping Rules approved by WADA.

Any competitor refusing a doping control will be violating the Anti-Doping Rule and may be immediately separated from the Central American and Caribbean Games and his credential withdrawn.

VENUE

The Rowing competition will take place at the Rowing Course of the Guatapé Reservoir in Antioquia.
